ประเภทที่ 1: ทุน Fulbright Thai Visiting Scholar ประจำปี 2551 จำนวน 3 ทุน (สำหรับอาจารย์ระดับมหาวิทยาลัย 2 ทุน และผู้ทรงคุณวุฒิที่มีประสบการณ์ทางวิชาการและในการทำการวิจัยชั้นสูง 1 ทุน) เพื่อทำการวิจัย บรรยายทางวิชาการเป็นระยะเวลา 3-6 เดือน ในสถาบันการศึกษาในประเทศสหรัฐอเมริกา

คุณสมบัติของผู้สมัคร: ผู้สมัครต้องมีสัญชาติไทย จบการศึกษาระดับปริญญาเอกหรือเทียบเท่า มีความรู้ภาษาอังกฤษเป็นอย่างดี มีประสบการณ์อย่างน้อย 10 ปีขึ้นไปในระดับมหาวิทยาลัยหรือเทียบเท่า (ไม่รวมระยะเวลาศึกษาต่อ) และสามารถสอนหรือวิจัย หรือทำกิจกรรมทางวิชาการร่วมกับสถาบันการศึกษาต่างๆ ณ ประเทศสหรัฐฯ ตามระยะเวลาที่กำหนด

ประเภทที่ 2: ทุน Fulbright-Thailand Research Fund Thai Junior Research Scholarship Program ประจำปี 2551 จำนวน 6 ทุน (สำหรับนักวิจัยภายใต้โครงการฟูลไบรท์จำนวน 1 ทุนและสำหรับนักเรียนทุนปริญญาเอกกาญจนาภิเษกภายใต้โครงการฟูลไบรท์ – สำนักงานกองทุนสนับสนุนการวิจัยจำนวน 5 ทุน) เพื่อวิจัยหรือสอนเป็นระยะเวลา 6 เดือนในสถาบันการศึกษาในประเทศสหรัฐอเมริกา

คุณสมบัติของผู้สมัคร: ผู้สมัครต้องมีสัญชาติไทย เป็นอาจารย์ที่กำลังศึกษาระดับปริญญาเอกในมหาวิทยาลัยภายในประเทศ (เฉพาะผู้สมัครภายใต้โครงการฟูลไบรท์เท่านั้น) มีผลการเรียนอยู่ในเกณฑ์ดี และมีผลคะแนน TOEFL อย่างน้อย 525 หรือ 195 สำหรับการสอบ TOEFL ด้วยระบบคอมพิวเตอร์ หรือ 70 ด้วยระบบ IBT (ผลคะแนน IELTS ไม่ต่ำกว่า 6.5 สามารถนำมาขึ้นสำหรับการคัดกรองเบื้องต้นเท่านั้น) และได้รับความเห็นชอบจากหน่วยงานต้นสังกัดหากได้รับการพิจารณาคัดเลือก

สำหรับทุนทั้ง 2 ประเภท

สาขาที่รับสมัคร: หัวข้อวิจัยด้านวิทยาศาสตร์ เทคโนโลยี การเมือง เศรษฐกิจ การค้า กฎหมาย วัฒนธรรมหรือ การศึกษาส่วนการบรรยายนั้น หัวข้อควรเกี่ยวข้องกับสังคมไทยในแง่มุมต่างๆ เช่น ศิลปะสมัยใหม่ ความสัมพันธ์ระหว่างประเทศไทยและสหรัฐอเมริกา หรือบทบาทของประเทศไทยในภูมิภาคแถบนี้ ทั้งนี้ ทุกหัวข้อที่เสนอควรจะเป็นการเน้นความสัมพันธ์ระหว่างไทยและสหรัฐฯ ด้วย

จุดเด่น:

- ผู้สมัครสามารถเสนอโครงการขอรับทุนเพื่อไปทำการวิจัยในด้านต่างๆ สำหรับงานวิจัยที่คนสนใจ มีความเชี่ยวชาญหรือความถนัด และ ไปในสถาบันที่คนเห็นเหมาะสม
- ผู้รับทุนได้รับสถานะนักวิจัยภายใต้โครงการฟูลไบรท์ซึ่งเป็นโปรแกรมที่มีชื่อเสียงและได้รับการยอมรับจากนานาประเทศ โดยเฉพาะในประเทศสหรัฐอเมริกา
- ผู้รับทุนได้รับโอกาสในการเข้าร่วมกิจกรรมที่มีประโยชน์ที่จัดโดยมูลนิธิฯ เพื่อการศึกษาและการวิจัยในสหรัฐฯ อย่างมีประสิทธิภาพสูงสุด เช่น Pre-departure orientation program และกิจกรรมนานาชาติที่จัดขึ้นเพื่อนักเรียนทุนและนักวิจัยภายใต้โครงการฟูลไบรท์ระหว่างอยู่ในสหรัฐฯ เช่น Occasional Lecturer Program, Enrichment Program รวมทั้งการสร้างเครือข่ายกับศิษย์เก่าฟูลไบรท์ชาวอเมริกันในรัฐต่างๆ ที่ทำการวิจัย
- การอำนวยความสะดวกด้านวีซ่า การประกันสุขภาพและอุบัติเหตุ และการประสานงานเกี่ยวกับกิจกรรมสำคัญต่างๆ ตลอดระยะเวลาที่ทำการวิจัยในสหรัฐฯ โดยองค์กรมาตรฐานนานาชาติ
- การสร้างและขยายเครือข่ายทางวิชาการนานาชาติที่มีคุณภาพและยั่งยืนกับสถาบันชั้นนำและนักวิจัยที่มีชื่อเสียงในสหรัฐฯ ซึ่งจะนำมาสานต่อในสถาบัน/องค์กรได้
- การเพิ่มบุคลากรที่จะมีมุมมองที่เป็นสากลทั้งด้านวิชาการและวิชาชีพ

THAI VISITING SCHOLAR COMPETITION
FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2008



The Thailand-United States Educational Foundation (Fulbright) announces its annual competition for Fulbright awards under the **Thai Visiting Scholar Program** which offers grants to senior Thai scholars to lecture, pursue research or undertake special academic-related projects in the United States.

Thai scholars are invited to submit proposals in various areas of expertise (sciences & technology and social and human sciences) for a grant to conduct research, lecture, or engage in special academic-related projects in the United States. For research projects, preference will be given to topics, which focus upon the Thailand-U.S. relationship in, for example, political, economic, trade, legal, cultural, or educational affairs. Lecturing projects should deal with topics relating to aspects of Thai society and economics, modern arts, Thai-U.S. relations, or Thailand's role in regional affairs.

Selection will be based on professional qualifications of applicants, and on the quality and significance of their project proposals. **Applicants are expected to explore in advance the most appropriate location for their research/lecturing projects and should be able to indicate that the proposed host institutions - universities, archives, institutes, etc. - are prepared to receive the scholars.** Project proposals will be considered under a condition that the applicant submits an invitation from a U.S. institution along with his/her application.

Up to three awards, two of which are reserved for university/faculty members while the other is for a researcher in Thai university or research institution, will be offered during the 2008 academic year for a period of 3-6 months. Funding for this program is through the Thailand-United States Educational Foundation under the Fulbright Program, and includes round-trip international travel, monthly stipend, professional allowance, settling-in allowance and health insurance. The monthly stipend ranges from US\$2,500 to 2,900 based on survey data on the relative cost of living. An additional allowance (approximately US\$200-350 per month) is given for qualified dependents who accompany the scholar for at least 80 percent of the grant period. Eligible dependents are spouse and children under 21.

ELIGIBILITY

An applicant must:

1. be a Thai citizen in good health;
2. be physically present in Thailand at the time of interview;
3. have a doctorate or the equivalent in academic background with strong knowledge of English;
4. have at least 10 years of professional experiences at the university level or equivalent (excluding period of study);
5. be able to take leave from his/her home institution or post;
6. preferably not have had extensive experience in the United States during the previous three years;

7. be able to fully participate in every activity organized by the Foundation, e.g. Pre-departure Orientation Program which will be held during June;
8. be willing and able to serve as a resource person in the United States, e.g. as a lecturer, seminar participant, consultant, or in other capacities requested by the host institution or community; and
9. be prepared to lecture and participate in academic activities related to the program undertaken upon return to Thailand.

The deadline for submission of application, proposal, curriculum vitae, academic credentials, two letters of recommendation, and one letter of invitation from U.S. institutions is **Friday, September 14, 2007**. 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How Scholars Are Selected

Selection Process

Initial screening and endorsement of eligible applications are done by the Fulbright Commission and final interview by the Binational Selection Committee. Name of selected candidates will be submitted to the Fulbright's Board of Directors for approval. The applications of candidates recommended for selection by the Fulbright Commission are submitted to the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board in Washington, D.C., composed of educational and public leaders, for final selection.

General Criteria

The objective of the Fulbright Scholar Program is to provide educational and research exchange experiences to a maximum number of individuals not previously afforded such an opportunity. The experience should also be of intrinsic value to Thailand, home institution, its faculty, and its students.

The program has afforded the opportunity to establish professional contacts in their fields and build long-lasting friendships with colleagues in the U.S.; develop collaborative research relationships with U.S. scholars; and enhance their publications and other scholarly contributions with research conducted in the U.S.

Country/Regional Guidelines

Binational Fulbright Commission in consultation with the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board usually establishes a specific timetable and guidelines for the selection of candidates for the program administration.

STRATEGIES FOR A SUCCESSFUL APPLICATION

A. The First Steps

Valuable preliminary steps include:

- ✦ **Planning Ahead** – Advance planning will give the scholars as much time as possible to put together a thoughtful and compelling application. Applicant review and final selection are based upon the actual application and accompanying materials.
- ✦ **Proposed Activity** – The candidate must demonstrate a clear justification to conduct research or professional development activities in the U.S. Feasibility of completing the project within the specified period and having the ability to conduct his/her research or professional development activities in English.
- ✦ **U.S. Affiliation** – It must be emphasized that host institution will be at recognized institution with very high standards and an excellent reputation in the applicant's proposed field.

B. Application Guidelines

- ✦ Complete the application form carefully.
- ✦ Submit all the required supporting documents including curriculum vitae, research proposal, academic credentials, two letters of recommendation, and letter of invitation of U.S. host institution.
- ✦ Make sure the completed application, the reference reports, project statement and supporting documents are submitted by the deadline.

- ✦ Choose references carefully and should be from people qualified to evaluate the applicant's professional work and written in English. At least one of the references should be from a specialist outside the university.
- ✦ Submit the letter of invitation which should be typed on institutional letterhead and signed. E-mail invitations are not sufficient.

C. Preparing the Project Statement

The project statement is the most important aspect of preparing the Fulbright application. Candidates with the most compelling, theoretically sound, well-written, feasible proposal are generally recommended for awards. The proposal should be thoroughly planned and described.

APPLICATION SUMMARY AND CHECKLIST

A correctly prepared application packet facilitates the review process and increases the applicant's chance for an award. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that the application is complete before submitting it to the Fulbright Commission.

All application components must be written in or translated into English.

A complete application includes:

- ☐ **Application form (3 pages)**
- ☐ **Detailed statement of proposed activity (3-5 pages typed)**
- ☐ **Detailed curriculum vitae**
- ☐ **Two letters of recommendation**
- ☐ **A letter of invitation from the U.S. institution**



GENERAL INFORMATION/PROVISIONS

The Thailand-U.S. Educational Foundation (Fulbright) in cooperation with the Thailand Research Fund (TRF) are pleased to announce the **"Fulbright-Thailand Research Fund Junior Research Scholarship Program,"** which is aimed to develop the capabilities of Thai university staff members to gain six months of research experience in the United States as part of their doctoral dissertation requirements.

Up to **six (6)** grants will be available for the 2008 academic year. **One will be awarded under the Fulbright program and five will be under the Fulbright-TRF partnership.** For the grant sponsored by TUSEF, benefits are intended to cover round-trip international airfare, monthly stipend for six months, books and supplies allowance, and an excess baggage allowance.

For grantees under the Fulbright-TRF partnership only: the Foundation will assist the grantees in visa process, coordinate on the U.S. university placement and offer other non-monetary benefits i.e. enrichment seminars, international conferences etc which help grantees to get access to highly advanced institutions and create quality international networks. Financial support will be fully sponsored by the Thailand Research Fund.

ELIGIBILITY

An applicant must:

- 1) Be a Thai citizen in good health (individuals holding U.S. immigrant visas or permanent U.S. resident cards (green cards), or dual (Thai and U.S.) citizenships are not eligible to apply.);
- 2) Be a university staff member at a tertiary level institution who is undertaking graduate work at the Ph.D. level in a Thai university (**applicable for the one award under the Fulbright program only**);
- 3) Be recommended by his/her employer for consideration;
- 4) Demonstrate strong academic performance at the graduate level;
- 5) Have appropriate background to undertake the proposal they have outlined;
- 6) Have the concurrence of the university Ph.D. program in which he/she is enrolled;
- 7) Have a paper-based TOEFL score of 525 or above (or at least 195 from a computer-based TOEFL test) or have IELTS scores of 6.5 or above;
- 8) Obtain written confirmation from a U.S. professor/scientist at the host institution that s/he will supervise the research; and
- 9) Be able to fully participate in every activity organized by the Foundation, e.g. Pre-departure Orientation Program which will be held during June.

The closing date for submission of applications, proposals, curriculum vitae, academic credentials, two letters of recommendation, a copy of the TOEFL/ IELTS test score report and written confirmation from U.S. institutions, is SEPTEMBER 14, 2007.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Valuable preliminary steps include:

- ✦ **Planning Ahead** – Advance planning will give the scholars as much time as possible to put together a thoughtful and compelling application. Application review and final selection are based upon the application submitted and accompanying materials.
- ✦ **Research Proposal** – The doctoral research proposal should be approved by dissertation advisors prior to the submission of the final Fulbright application to the Fulbright Commission.
- ✦ **U.S. Affiliation** – Host Institution must be a recognized Institution with very high standards and which has an excellent reputation in the application's proposed field.

Application Guidelines:

- ✦ Complete the application form carefully after reading instructions thoroughly.
- ✦ Submit all the required supporting documents (**proposals, curriculum vitae, academic credentials, two letters of recommendation, a copy of the TOEFL/IELTS test score report and written confirmation from U.S. Institutions**).
- ✦ Make sure the completed application, proposal, two recommendation letters, U.S. Institution's confirmation letter, TOEFL/IELTS score report and CV. are submitted by the deadline.

Preparing the Project Statement

The project statement is the most important aspect of preparing the Fulbright application. Candidates with the most compelling, theoretically sound, well-written, feasible proposal are generally recommended for awards. The proposal should be nicely organized and described.
